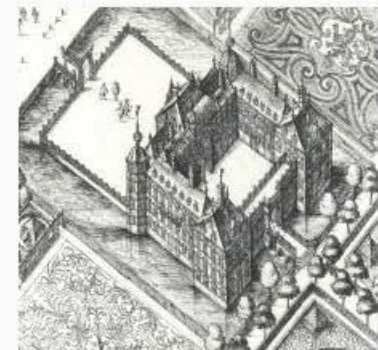

Parts 2 (Impact) and 3 (Implementation) usually make the difference in the score, and necessitate a high level of “Europeak” in writing – also, as scientists, we are (usually) not trained in communication science
